### **WAIHEKE ISLAND**

- For all properties that pay a waste charge, there is a
  weekly rubbish and fortnightly recycling collection
  service. Place your council rubbish bins or bags and
  recycling bins or bags out on the roadside before 7am
  on your collection day.
- Please refer to aucklandcouncil.govt.nz for up to date collection information, including delays due to public holidays.
- For properties that don't pay a waste charge, you can purchase official Auckland Council rubbish bags that can be placed out for collection on your collection day. These are available for purchase from Waiheke Library or from Four Square and Countdown on the island.
- You can drop off your waste and recycling to Waiheke Community Resource Recovery Park at 108 – 110 Ostend Road, Waiheke.
  - · Gate fees may apply.
  - Clean and sorted recycling, and Auckland Council rubbish bags are accepted for free.
- After hours visitor bins are located at Waiheke
   Community Resource Recovery Park. These bins will
   be available after hours for visitors to the island to
   drop off household rubbish in official Auckland Council
   rubbish bags, and loose co-mingled recyclables,
   before leaving.
  - The bins will only be accessible from 4:30pm to 8am daily.
  - No illegal dumping, inorganic material, hazardous waste or green waste.
  - These bins will be monitored.

### YOUR FOOD SCRAPS CAN BE A VALUABLE RESOURCE!

Food scraps are full of valuable nutrients, nitrogen, and carbon. They can be made into compost, then used to feed soil that in turn grows more plants and vegetables.

On average each Aucklander sends about 160kg of rubbish to landfill every year.

- Of this, 65% can be avoided or put to better use.
- Up to 45% of rubbish is food scraps.

Collecting and composting food scraps means less rubbish goes to landfill.

Please compost your food scraps wherever possible.

We encourage all boaties and visitors to reduce the amount of waste they bring to the islands by planning ahead, removing items from packaging before visiting, and making use of reusable containers, drink bottles and coffee cups wherever possible.

### AOTEA / GREAT BARRIER ISLAND

- There are no public rubbish or recycling bins on the island.
- For all properties that pay a waste charge, there is a weekly roadside rubbish and recycling collection service. Place your council rubbish bags, rubbish bins, recycling crates, recycling bags, and bundled and secured paper/cardboard out on the roadside before 8am on your collection day.
- Please refer to aucklandcouncil.govt.nz for up to date collection information, including delays due to public holidays.
- For properties that don't pay a waste charge, you
  can purchase official Auckland Council rubbish and
  recycling bags that can be placed out for collection on
  your collection day. These are available for purchase
  from Great Barrier Island Service Centre and may be
  available from local stores around the island.
- You can drop rubbish off to the Aotea Transfer Station at 70 Gray Road, Claris.
- · Gate fees may apply.
- Auckland Council rubbish bags are accepted for free.
- Recyclable and reusable items, and food scraps, can be dropped to Anamata Community Recycling Centre at 66C Gray Road, Claris.
  - Disposal charges may apply.
  - Clean and sorted recycling will be accepted for free.

- There are eight public drop-off points located around the island for you to drop off your rubbish and recycling.
- Please ensure you separate out your waste into the correct bins provided. This is transported regularly to Home Bay for sorting, and transportation to the mainland.

Call us on 0800 NO DUMP



If you see dumped rubbish on public property, call **0800 NO DUMP** (0800 663 867) 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Your rubbish is your responsibility, and dumping it is illegal. Offenders caught dumping rubbish will be ordered to remove it and may be issued with a fine of up to \$30,000.
